MEMPHIS, TN. (June 27, 2017) After introducing the resolution that created the Neighborhood Sentinel Program in April, Councilman Philip Spinosa is excited to announce that ten new cameras have been installed within each of the seven districts in Memphis.

“The Memphis Police Department analyzed data and incident reports to determine the best placement of security cameras to combat crime in our city,” says Councilman Spinosa. “We are confident that the areas chosen for these seventy cameras were those most affected by crime and public safety issues in our city.”
