



1. Description of the Item (Resolution, Ordinance, etc.)

This item is a resolution that accepts, allocates, and appropriates Fifteen Thousand Twenty Two Dollars and Zero Cents (\$15,022.00) in CARES Grant funds for the Memphis Public Library & Information Center from the Tennessee State Library and Archives for videoconferencing equipment.

The Memphis Public Library & Information Center has drafted this resolution and is recommending City Council approval. The funds associated with this grant will benefit all City Council Districts.

3. State whether this is a change to an existing ordinance or resolution, if applicable.



This amendment requires a new contract with the State of Tennessee, Office of the Secretary of State, Tennessee State Library and Archives and the City of Memphis.

This program requires an FY21 budget amendment to accept, allocate and appropriate Fifteen Thousand Twenty Two Dollars and Zero Cents (\$15,022.00) in CARES Grant funds from the State of Tennessee, Office of the Secretary of State, and Tennessee State Library and Archives for videoconferencing equipment.



A Resolution to accept, allocate and appropriate grant funds in the amount of Fifteen Thousand Twenty Two Dollars and Zero Cents (\$15,022.00) from the State of Tennessee, Office of the Secretary of State, Tennessee State Library and Archives.

WHEREAS, the City of Memphis, Division of Library Services, Memphis Public Library and Information Center has received CARES Grant funds in the amount of Fifteen Thousand Twenty Two Dollars and Zero Cents (\$15,022.00) from the State of Tennessee, Office of the Secretary of State, Tennessee State Library and Archives; and

WHEREAS, these CARES Grant funds will be used to purchase videoconferencing equipment; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to amend the Fiscal Year 2021 Operating Budget to establish funds for videoconferencing equipment; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to accept, allocate, and appropriate the grant funds in the amount of Fifteen Thousand Twenty Two Dollars and Zero Cents (\$15,022.00) from the State of Tennessee, Office of the Secretary of State, Tennessee State Library and Archives for videoconferencing equipment;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Memphis that Grant funds in the amount of Fifteen Thousand Twenty Two Dollars and Zero Cents (\$15,022.00) from the State of Tennessee, Office of the Secretary of State, Tennessee State Library and Archives to purchase videoconferencing equipment be accepted by the City of Memphis;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Fiscal Year 2021 Operating Budget be and is hereby amended by allocating and appropriating the revenues and expenditures for videoconferencing equipment in the amount of Fifteen Thousand Twenty Two Dollars and Zero Cents (\$15,022.00) from the State of Tennessee, Office of the Secretary of State, Tennessee State Library and Archives; as follows:

WHEREAS, the City Council gratefully records and extends its sincere appreciation to **Rev. Joseph H. McGhee, Jr.** for his faithful and excellent service rendered to our City as an exemplary citizen worthy of this City's highest recognition.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED That McEwen Place between Willoughby Street and South Wellington Street be honorarily dedicated as

“Rev. Joseph H. McGhee, Jr. Place”

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That the City Engineer is requested to affix a suitable marker so designating such public thoroughfare.

Resolution Recognizing the Importance of the 2020 Census and Encouraging Participation Toward a Complete Count of all Memphians

WHEREAS, the 2020 Census counts every person living in the United States and five U.S. territories, mandated by the Constitution and conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau every 10 years; and

WHEREAS, it has never been easier to respond, the 2020 Census is quick, safe, and easy to complete, with respondents having the ability to complete the census online for the first time, as well as over the phone or through the mail; and

WHEREAS, United States Code section 2108(b) of title 44 prohibits the Census Bureau from sharing any personally identifiable information from the decennial census with any part of the government or private entity, for any purpose; and

WHEREAS, the data collected by the 2020 Census will determine congressional representation, inform hundreds of billions of dollars in federal funding every year, and provide data that will impact Memphis for the next decade; and

WHEREAS, complete and accurate census data will help ensure that resources for education, healthcare, rural development, workforce training, housing, transportation and other matters are allocated fairly and accurately across the City of Memphis; and

WHEREAS, the 2020 Census will provide a snapshot of our City—who we are, where we live, and so much more as we continue to move Memphis forward, together.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Memphis City Council recognizes the importance of the 2020 Census and supports participation and partnerships in helping to ensure a complete, fair and accurate count.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Memphis City Council encourages all citizens of Memphis and U.S. residents to respond to the 2020 Census, to ensure that all people living throughout our City and the entire United States are included.
