

**EXECUTIVE ORDER EXTENDING STATE OF EMERGENCY  
BY MAYOR JIM STRICKLAND, CITY OF MEMPHIS**

**No. 57-2020**

**WHEREAS**, Coronavirus Disease 2019 (“COVID-19”) is a communicable respiratory disease that can lead to serious illness or death, particularly in the case of elderly adults and persons with serious chronic medical conditions; and

**WHEREAS**, on January 21, 2020, following the guidance of Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the Tennessee Department of Health designated COVID-19 as a reportable disease in Tennessee.

**WHEREAS**, on March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization declared the COVID-19 outbreak a global pandemic. On March 12, 2020, the Governor for the State of Tennessee issued an Executive Order to facilitate the treatment and containment of COVID-19, pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated § 58-2-107(e)(1). On March 13, 2020, the President of the United States declared a national state of emergency in response to the COVID-19 pandemic; and

**WHEREAS**, on March 17, 2020, I declared a state of emergency for the City of Memphis, pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated § 58-2-101 et seq. and § 38-9-101 et seq. and City of Memphis Code §§ 9-24-2, 9-8-4, and 2-58-7 in response to the COVID-19 pandemic; and

**WHEREAS**, on March 19, 2020, the Governor for the State of Tennessee issued Executive Order No. 15, and subsequent Executive Orders, declaring that “a state of emergency and major disaster exists to facilitate the response to COVID-19”; and

**WHEREAS**, COVID-19 continues to present a danger to public health through community transmission, which has resulted in the loss of over 800 lives in Shelby County to the virus and has significantly strained the hospitals and the public health system;

**WHEREAS**, on December 20, 2020, the Governor issued Executive Order No. 70 limiting social gatherings and restricting spectators at sporting events to further facilitate the State’s response to the COVID-19 pandemic; and

**WHEREAS**, on December 21, 2020, the Shelby County Health Department issued Face Mask Order No. 4 and Health Directive No. 16, which closed entertainment and recreational establishments and imposed restrictions on certain activities and social gatherings.

**WHEREAS**, as of December 22, 2020, the Shelby County Health Department has reported at least 62,334 confirmed and probable cases of COVID-19 in Shelby County, at least 821 deaths caused by COVID-19, and that workplace and community transmission is occurring; and

**WHEREAS**, as of December 22, 2020, there were at least 529,578 positive COVID-19 tests reported in the state of Tennessee; and


**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated § 58-2-110(3)(A)(v), the duration of a state of emergency declared locally is limited to seven (7) days and may be extended, as necessary, in seven-day increments; and

**WHEREAS**, the continued danger to public health necessitates the extension of the Declaration of State of Emergency I originally issued on March 17, 2020 and subsequently extended by Executive Order

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM STRICKLAND, MAYOR OF THE CITY OF MEMPHIS** by virtue of the power vested in me, declare a state of emergency continues to exist as it relates to COVID-19 and the response to COVID-19 (“Emergency”). Pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated § 58-2-110(3)(A)(v), the Declaration of State of Emergency originally issued on March 17, 2020 and extended by subsequent Executive Orders is hereby extended for seven (7) days and I hereby continue to invoke the authority granted by Tenn. Code Ann. §§ 58-2-110, 58-2-104, 38-9-103 and 38-9-104 as well as City Code §§ 9-24-2, 9-8-4 and 2-58-7 and all other applicable law for the duration of the Emergency.

Upon signature, this Order shall become effective on December 22, 2020.
