## RESIDENTIAL FIRE 92 S. Fernway Road

**MEMPHIS, TN** - The Memphis **Fire** Department responded to a house fire at 92 S. Fernway Road, Monday, May 3, 2021 at 2:28 p.m. Upon arrival on the scene, firefighters reported smoke visible from the one-story wood frame residential structure. Rescue and Firefighting operations began immediately.

Thirteen (13) pieces of **Fire/Rescue/EMS** equipment and approximately twenty-nine (29) emergency response personnel ultimately responded to the call. Battalion Chief D. Waddell was the commanding officer of this incident. The fire was brought under control at 2:43 p.m. *One firefighter was transported in stable condition to Baptist East Hospital for heat exhaustion. He was treated and later released.* There were no civilian injuries. Red Cross assistance was not requested.



It has been determined that the residence **did not have** a working smoke alarm. The structure sustained smoke, fire and water damage. Total damage is estimated at \$8,000.00 structure and no contents. The origin and cause of the fire was determined to be a ventilation fan that malfunctioned in the bathroom ceiling.

The Memphis **Fire** Department urges all citizens to maintain a working smoke alarm in their place of residence. Check smoke alarms once a month and change the battery when you change your clocks.
