## RESIDENTIAL FIRE

3002 Egan Drive

MEMPHIS, TN - The Memphis Fire Department responded to a house fire at 3002 Egan Drive, Monday, June 7, 2021 at 1:14 a.m. Upon arrival on the scene, firefighters reported heavy fire visible from the one-story wood frame residential structure. Rescue and Firefighting operations began immediately.

Thirteen (13) pieces of Fire/Rescue/EMS equipment and approximately twenty-nine (29) emergency response personnel ultimately responded to the call. Battalion Chief A. Bradshaw was the commanding officer of this incident. The fire was brought under control at 1:39 a.m. There were no firefighter or civilian injuries.

It has been determined that the residence **did not have** a working smoke alarm. The home sustained smoke, fire and water damage. Total damage is estimated at \$50,000.00 structure and no contents. The origin and cause of the fire was determined to be an electrical outlet that malfunctioned in the storage room. Red Cross assistance was not requested.

The Memphis Fire Department urges all citizens to maintain a working smoke alarm in their place of residence. Check smoke alarms once a month and change the battery when you change your clocks.
