RESIDENTIAL FIRE

4165 Arrowood Avenue

MEMPHIS, TN - The Memphis Fire Department responded to a house fire at 4165 Arrowood Avenue, Monday, June 7, 2021 at 12:31 a.m. Upon arrival on the scene, firefighters reported heavy fire visible from the one-story wood frame residential structure. Rescue and Firefighting operations began immediately.

Thirteen (13) pieces of Fire/Rescue/EMS equipment and approximately twenty-nine (29) emergency response personnel ultimately responded to the call. Acting Battalion Chief K. Dillard was the commanding officer of this incident. The fire was brought under control at 12:53 a.m. There were no firefighter or civilian injuries. *The family dog expired as a result of this incident.*

It has been determined that the residence **did not have** a working smoke alarm. The home sustained smoke, fire and water damage. Total damage is estimated at \$50,000.00 structure and \$25,000.00 contents. The origin and cause of the fire was determined to be faulty electrical wiring in the living room wall. Red Cross provided assistance for one adult and three children.

The Memphis Fire Department urges all citizens to maintain a working smoke alarm in their place of residence. Check smoke alarms once a month and change the battery when you change your clocks.
