RESIDENTIAL FIRE

3537 Chowning Road

MEMPHIS, TN - The Memphis Fire Department responded to an alarm of fire at 3537 Chowning Road, Saturday, July 3, 2021 at 9:58 p.m. Upon arrival on the scene, firefighters reported heavy fire visible from the one-story wood residential structure. Rescue and Firefighting operations began immediately.

Thirteen (13) pieces of Fire/Rescue/EMS equipment and approximately twenty-eight (28) emergency response personnel ultimately responded to the call. Acting Battalion Chief J. Russell was the commanding officer of this incident. The fire was brought under control at 10:11 p.m. There were no firefighter or civilian injuries.

It has been determined that the residence **did have** a working smoke alarm. The structure and a vehicle sustained smoke, fire and water damage. Total damage is estimated at \$150,000.00 structure and \$80,000.00 contents. The origin and cause of the fire was determined to be faulty wiring in the electrical panel in the garage. Red Cross provided assistance for two adults and two children.

The Memphis Fire Department urges all citizens to maintain a working smoke alarm in their place of residence. Check smoke alarms once a month and change the battery when you change your clocks.
