RESIDENTIAL FIRE

2059 Montreat Drive

MEMPHIS, TN - The Memphis Fire Department responded to a house fire at 2059 Montreat Drive, Tuesday, August 3, 2021 at 2:25 a.m. Upon arrival on the scene, firefighters reported fire visible from the one-story wood frame residential structure. Rescue and Firefighting operations began immediately.

Twelve (12) pieces of Fire/Rescue/EMS equipment and approximately twenty-eight (28) emergency response personnel ultimately responded to the call. Acting Battalion Chief M. Montgomery was the commanding officer of this incident. The fire was brought under control at 2:47 a.m. There were no firefighter or civilian injuries. Red Cross assistance was not requested.



It has been determined that the residence **did have** a working smoke alarm. The structure sustained smoke, fire and water damage. Total damage is estimated at \$100,000.00 structure and \$20,000.00 contents. The origin and cause of the fire was determined to be an A/C unit that malfunctioned in the attic.

The Memphis Fire Department urges all citizens to maintain a working smoke alarm in their place of residence. Check smoke alarms once a month and change the battery when you change your clocks.
