RESIDENTIAL FIRE 1371 Orgill Avenue

MEMPHIS, TN - The Memphis Fire Department responded to a vacant house fire at 1371 Orgill Avenue, Thursday, September 16, 2021 at 6:39 a.m. Upon arrival on the scene, firefighters reported heavy fire visible from the one-story wood frame residential structure.

Seventeen (17) pieces of Fire/Rescue/EMS equipment and approximately thirty-six (36) emergency response personnel ultimately responded to the call. Battalion Chief C. Wilkins was the commanding officer of this incident. The fire was brought under control at 7:06 a.m. One firefighter was treated and released on the scene with minor chest injuries. There were no civilian injuries.



The vacant home sustained smoke, fire and

water damage. Total damage is estimated at \$3,000.00 building and no contents. The origin and cause of the fire was determined to be intentionally set in the living room. This fire is still under investigation. Anyone with information regarding this incident is asked to call Crime Stoppers at 528-CASH (2274) or the State Arson Hotline at 1-800-762-3017. You could be eligible to receive a cash reward from Crime Stoppers of Memphis and Shelby County, Inc.

The Memphis Fire Department urges all citizens to maintain a working smoke alarm in their place of residence. Check smoke alarms once a month and change the battery when you change your clocks.
