





#### What is TBRA?

- The TBRA program provides rental assistance for low-income households that are homeless who are members of special needs populations (the disabled, elderly & victims of domestic violence).
- The rental assistance may not exceed HUD's Fair Market Rent nor TWO years of funding for eligible households.
- Successful agencies must supply supportive services to the program participants to help them maintain stable housing.



### What agencies can apply?

Non-profit organizations with 501 (C) (3) (for at least 1 year), tax exempt status, current Tennessee charter; financial statements / audit; general liability insurance; and that meet other requirements found in the Agency Profile.



Who is eligible for assistance?

Eligible participants are limited to very-low income persons that are homeless and members of a special needs group.

Eligible participants are required to have income to qualify for the program.



#### **ELIGIBLE PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS**

- Homeless individual a person who resides in one of the following places:
  - in places not meant for human habitation
  - an emergency shelter / transitional housing
  - a transitional housing facility for those who originally came from the streets or an emergency shelter



#### **ELIGIBLE PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS**

- 2. Special Needs Populations
- Elderly are 62 years of age or older.
- Victim of domestic violence is an adult with/without children battered by an intimate partner
- Person with disabilities



#### Person with disabilities

- mental or emotional
  impairment of long-continued and
  indefinite duration; that
  substantially impedes their ability to
  live independently; & that could be
  improved by more suitable housing
  conditions; or
- has a developmental disability per 42 U.S.C. (part of HUD regulations regarding disabilities)



### **ELIGIBLE PARTICIPANTS:**

3. **Very low-income persons** as described in the Agency Profile



### Operating Costs of TBRA Program

Community Development Block Grant funds are automatically provided to help pay operating costs for implementing a HOME TBRA program. If you propose to serve 10-15 households, you are awarded \$60,000. If you propose to serve 16 or more, you are awarded 25% of your total awarded amount from the TBRA program. This is described in the HOME TBRA application packet.

Note: A Unit with 4 persons, 2 adults & 2 kids, is still 1 household.



Funding Amount Available in FY24 - \$300,000 to pay up to 2 years rental assistance for eligible lowincome households that are homeless and have special needs.
